Specialized Counselors

The unique needs of individuals are served through specialized counselors in the following areas:

- Transition - Assist individuals who are transitioning from high school to work
- Supported Employment - Work with the most significantly disabled individuals needing on-going supports
- Deaf and Hard of Hearing - Work with individuals with severe hearing loss (55 db loss or greater) and deafness
- Hard of Hearing - Work with individuals with a 40-55 db hearing loss
- Alcohol and Drug Addiction - Assistance with individuals seeking employment following treatment



Community Rehabilitation Programs

A network of facilities offering comprehensive vocational evaluation services and work adjustment training.

Business Development Services

Employment Coordinators who network and form partnerships with businesses in order to create job opportunities for individuals with disabilities.

Assistive Technology

Rehabilitation Technologists trained in engineering to perform specialized evaluations to determine if assistive technology will benefit an individual with a disability.
